EUROPE

France (Toulouse / Bordeaux)

February 4

Today, we distributed Bibles at a nearby university for the first time. The response was so overwhelming that we had to go back to get more Bibles. During the entire time, each team member was engaged in a meaningful conversation. The Lord really answered our prayer to declare His victory over the young people in Toulouse.

In the evening, we joined a gospel meeting for college students. Someone new who was contacted last week joined the meeting and got baptized! We are very encouraged that the Lord answered our prayer for multiple baptisms during our time in Toulouse and Bordeaux.

Prayer burdens:

1. To release shepherds for consistent appointments with all the new ones we have met.
2. That two families would migrate to Toulouse to strengthen the church life here.

France (Paris 4 - Palaiseau)

February 5

Today, we visited a brother at the Polytechnic Institute of Paris campus. In the evening, two new contacts came to dinner, including the young man we met yesterday. We had very sweet fellowship on how to eat Jesus, and everyone left knowing that God is good for food!

Prayer burdens:

Germany (Hamburg)

Mid-Atlantic

Washington, D.C.

February 3-4

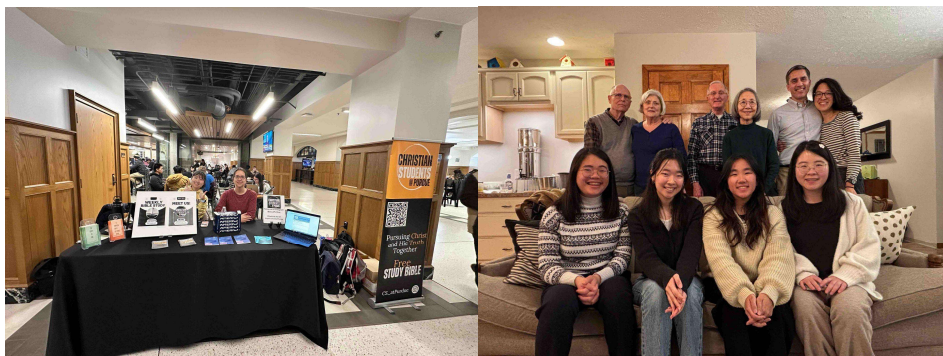

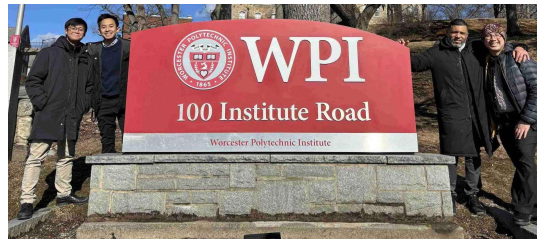
