### January 30, 2026

## EUROPE

### Ireland

*January 28*

We have continued to go out to University College Dublin (UCD) to preach the gospel and sow seeds among young Irish students. In the evening, we attended a blending meeting with the saints in Dublin, sharing our testimonies and any positive experiences from our times on the gospel.

*January 29*

We returned to UCD for the gospel. A student prayed to receive the Lord with us and we found out later that he was an old friend of one of the new ones in the church in Dublin. In the evening, the brothers had a Bible study with some new ones and the sisters attended a sisters fellowship.

*January 30*

On our final day at UCD, seven students on this campus prayed to receive the Lord and over 150 tracts were given out. In the evening, we attended the college meeting with an emphasis on the gospel, as many new ones attended this time.

January 29

Since we do not have a club in the University of Malaga, we could only table outside the campus. We found an intersection across the campus and started our Bible distribution. In Malaga, it is the university's exam period, so there was not much traffic. We were broken up into several groups. Some stayed at the table and some went out to preach the gospel. We had a good conversation with a group of Polish tourists and referred them to [BiblesforEurope.org](http://BiblesforEurope.org). In the evening, we had a sweet time of fellowship with the local saints in the homes.

January 30

Today, we went to the city center for tabling. There was much more traffic than yesterday, so we had more conversations with people and passed out more tracts and Bibles. One prayed with us! In the evening, we had a young people's meeting at the meeting hall. We shared our testimonies of how the Lord brought us to the full-time training. May this be an encouragement for the young people to be open to be trained in the Lord's hand.

## Mid-Atlantic

## Pennsylvania

January 26-27

### Madison, WI / Minneapolis, MN

January 25-27

The first full day in Minneapolis, Minnesota started with the Lord's table and prophesying meeting, followed by a love feast. The following two days we had personal time and much corporate prayer regarding the current situation in Minneapolis and the gospel before our outreach on campus.

No one has been arrested or detained, but a few saints have been questioned. We are not quite sure what will happen on campus. It seems that fewer students may be going out. There have been large protests and we anticipate more. We are not taking sides in this matter, but no matter who is right or wrong, this chaotic situation is not conducive to preaching the gospel. There are six trainees here this week to preach the gospel on the campus, and we have planned a full week of outreach.

January 28

We began the morning with personal time, coordination, and prayer before tabling/flyering/preaching the gospel on campus. The Lord arranged some divine appointments in the afternoon before we prepared for the evening student dinner and ministry message. They were both an enjoyable time where we could see some of the students take some responsibility and lead in the club.

We tabled for Bibles for America and the Christian Students club at Central Connecticut State University (CCSU). One sister had an appointment with a new one, Y, who we met the week before. Two of the other sisters met with another new one. After our time on campus we met up with the saints from Storrs for lunch and enjoyed a time of blending and fellowship, then traveled to Storrs where we will be for the remaining duration of our trip. In the evening we had an orientation to hear about the history of the local churches in New England and what the Lord is currently doing in Storrs today.

January 28

We joined the full-timers at UConn Health for a Bible study with some of the students there. A club has newly formed there and the Lord has opened the way for there to be a strengthened testimony of Christ at this school. In the evening we had dinner and the prayer meeting with the saints.

January 29

In the morning we spent some time learning about the history of the Lord's recovery from Luther to Lee. On the University of Connecticut (UConn) Storrs campus we set up two tables: one table for Bible distribution outside and a table for the club inside. There was a very positive response to the distribution of the Bibles and two new ones, A and R, that we met while tabling joined us for the college meeting in the evening. One student who came to the college meeting was especially interested in asking about the training, which opened a way to share with him a little concerning what it's like and our experience.

*January 27*

### Sacramento, CA / Reno, NV

*January 23 -24*

The campus team went to table at the University of Nevada Reno again. The children/young people team traveled to Carson City and held a neighborhood children's meeting at the park near a high school. *January 25*

Followed by prayer and practical coordinating, the saints split up into two teams each day to labor on two campuses.

At Sac State, the full-time team, trainees, and college students were tabling and promoting the club since it was the first week of school. The club held a field day activity on campus, and on Wednesday night had a welcome gathering. Several students we met while tabling had joined, and the club enjoyed activities and dinner together.

At ARC and Sac City, saints and trainees gave away Bibles and tracts. Many of the students were open to having a conversation and receive a Bible.
