### January 31, 2026

## EUROPE

### Germany (Düsseldorf)

*January 30*

In the late morning, we began our final Bible distribution for the University of Duisburg-Essen. Following this, we prepared the new student center facility, which had finally opened this week to the saints and students after seven months of waiting for approval. Some local saints and the trainees cleaned the floor, walls, and windows, as well as brought in all the necessary supplies to prepare dinner. Approximately ten students (returning and new ones) attended the college meeting that evening. This was the first student meeting in Essen in that facility, which gave more room for an increase of students to enjoy the Lord together near campus.

# Germany (Hamburg)

*January 29*

Today we went out to both campuses, Hamburg University of Applied Sciences (HAW) and University of Hamburg (Uni Hamburg), but we switched up the teams so we were able to experience different campuses. At HAW, in particular today, we felt students were open when approached randomly. We even ran into the new one who attended the Bible study on January 28. At Uni Hamburg, as well, it seems that there were more conversations. Ending the night, we all gathered at a Russian family's home where we shared our experiences of touching the Lord and coming to the full-time training, along with their experience in the full-time training and work life.

*January 30*

Today was the coldest day out on the gospel and our last day on the college campus. Since it was colder outside, we decided to only go to Uni Hamburg. We brought a guitar to sing hymns. We felt students were looking at the table more and grabbing tracts, but the foot traffic was significantly less because of the weather. In the evening, we all joined different small groups.

*January 31*

Today was our last day on the gospel. We went to Europa Passage again, thinking we would not have much luck with conversations and Bible distribution. However, in an hour, we spoke to many who were very open to receive a Bible and even give their contact information. Tonight, we had our gospel dinner where we spoke on "The Mystery of Human Life." We had seven students join us and get further connected to the saints here.

# Luxembourg

January 29

We visited a family, who was the first family moved to Luxembourg, to know about their history and how they found the Lord's recovery through the ministry of Watchman Nee and Witness Lee. This dear couple introduced their whole family—the nephew, two daughters and their son—into the church life. Last year, they hosted all the gospel teams sent to Luxembourg during the Summer Olympics for fifty days. It was a time of blending and realizing the importance of the Body in the Lord's move in Europe.

These two days we had coordination in the morning and then distributed Bibles in Kraków. In the evenings, we had home meetings where we were refreshed to share our enjoyment of Christ with the saints and hear their testimonies.

*January 31*

Today, we along with many saints from Kraków, drove to Sosnowiec to have coordination with the local saints. After lunch, we distributed Bibles in Katowice, the biggest city nearby. In the evening we had dinner with our hospitality.

### Canada

### Calgary, AB / Edmonton, AB / Lethbridge, AB

*January 26*

The trainees traveled from Edmonton to Lloydminster to visit and blend with the saints. We enjoyed a very sweet time of fellowship and corporate morning revival the following day. We were deeply encouraged by the testimony and pursuit of the saints in this smaller locality, even though there is not yet a lampstand.

*January 27*

The trainees and local saints went out to the University of Alberta in Edmonton for a Bible distribution. Many students were open, and a total of fifty-three New Testament Bibles were distributed, along with some ministry books and gospel tracts.
